We go for the RIDE and if a road has hills, curves, scenery, decent pavement and not much traffic it’s our kind of fun! The exception to this is Route 66. For most riders the appeal of the Mother Road is not spectacular scenery, twisty, high elevation passes or an abundance of places to challenge your riding skill. On Route 66, the magic is in the STOPS, the history and the personalities you’ll meet along the way.
